



The Association of Nene River Clubs

Association Rules

- 1, The NAME of the Association is 'Association of Nene River Clubs' and its pennant will be a gold star on a blue background.**
- 2, The OBJECT for which the Association is formed is to provide a liaising body for the benefit of all Clubs on the River Nene and adjacent waterways, to encourage boating of all classes, and to provide facilities whenever required. To negotiate on behalf of member Clubs with River Authorities, Harbourmasters, and such other Associations or persons as may be necessary.**
- 3, MEMBERSHIP shall be of two classes:**
 - A. Club membership, consisting of representation from Clubs on the River Nene and adjacent waterways.**
 - B. Individual membership for those wishing to avail themselves of facilities provided by the Association, particularly in tidal areas. Membership of this class shall entitle the member to carry a gold star pennant.**
- 4. Candidates for membership as in 3b above shall be nominated by Member Clubs, and the members nominated shall be members of the Club making the nomination. A person who is not a member of one of the clubs forming the Association may apply in writing for individual membership. Every such application will be decided on its merit by the Committee of the Association.**
- 5. ELECTION OF MEMBERS**
as in 3b shall be at a meeting of the Committee of the Association and a simple majority will be sufficient for election.
- 6. Every member on joining the Association: impliedly undertakes to comply with these Rules and any refusal or neglect to do so, or any conduct which in the opinion of the Committee is either unworthy of a member or otherwise injurious to the interests of the Association, shall render a member liable to expulsion by the Committee, provided that before expelling a member such Committee shall call upon him for an explanation of his conduct, and shall give him an opportunity of defending himself or of resigning his membership. The vote on a resolution for expulsion shall be by ballot, and the resolution shall only be carried if not less than three quarters of the members of the Committee present vote in favour of the resolution.**

7. SUBSCRIPTION

For membership under 3b, £5 per person annually; payable on the 1st January in each year or part thereof.

For membership under 3A, such levies on member Club as may be decided by the Committee from time to time.

8. OFFICERS

The Officers of the Association shall consist of Captain, Vice Captain, Secretary. To be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting in each year, to hold office until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting. Nominations for Officers to be in the hands of the Secretary SEVEN clear days before the date of the Annual General Meeting. Retiring Officers shall be eligible for re-election.

8a. TRUSTEES

There shall be three Trustees, who shall be appointed by an Annual General Meeting, and who shall hold office until such time as they may resign, or are removed by the resolution of a General Meeting.

9. COMMITTEE

The Committee shall consist of two members from each club in the Association, both of whom will be eligible to vote. The elected Officers of the Association shall be additional to and part of this Committee, and have the right to vote.

SUB COMMITTEES

The Committee shall have the right to form a Sub-Committee to deal with any special project. The Sub-committee shall consist of members of the Association under 3A or 3B, but at least one of the Officers of the Association will be a member of the Sub-Committee.

10. MANAGEMENT

(a) The affairs of the Association shall be wholly managed by the Committee according to these rules. Such Committee shall apply the funds of the Association in such a manner as complies with sub-rule (b) of this rule, and shall make such bylaws, rules and regulations as it thinks fit as to the management of any Association premises.

(b) No money or property of the Association or any gain arising from the carrying on of the Association shall be applied otherwise than for the benefit of the Association as a whole.

(c) All cases involving dispute, disciplinary and other contentious matters not provided for in the rules shall be referred to the Committee, and their decision shall be final.

(d) The members of the Association may, in General Meeting reserve the management of such affairs as they think fit to general meeting and/or a Special Committee.

(e) The financial year of the Association shall end on the 31st day of December, and it shall be the responsibility of the Treasurer to keep a complete and accurate account of the Association finances. A banking account shall be kept in the name of the Association, and the Captain, the Vice Captain, Secretary and Treasurer shall be authorised to sign cheques and withdrawal slips. The

signature of the Treasurer, countersigned by that of the Captain, Vice Captain or Secretary shall be accepted as valid.

11. At the Annual General Meeting in each year an Auditor shall be appointed, whose: duty it shall be to audit the Association accounts for the current year. A copy of the audited accounts shall be circulated to all members prior to the Annual General Meeting in each year.

12. GENERAL MEETINGS

(a) An Annual General Meeting shall be held on some day, in the month of March or April each year. No business (except the passing of the accounts, the election of the Officers, the appointment of the Auditor and any business that the general Committee may order to be inserted in the notice convening the meeting) shall be discussed at such meeting unless notice thereof be given to the Secretary TWENTY ONE days before the meeting.

(b) The Committee may at any time call a General Meeting of the Association for any specific business. The discussion at such general meetings shall be confined to the business stated in the notice sent to members.

13. VISITING YACHTSMEN

A member of any club recognised by the Royal Yachting Association (a list whereof is contained in the Year Book of the said Association) or any other Association recognised by the Association of Nene River Clubs, may be authorised to use the premises and moorings of the Association. Such authorisation shall specify between which dates, not being more than fourteen days apart, the said person may so use the Association facilities.

14. NEW RULES, AMENDMENTS AND ALTERATIONS

(a) Notice of any alteration or addition to the rules intended to be proposed by a member of the Association shall be given to the Secretary in writing TWENTY ONE days before the Annual General Meeting, if same is to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting, and full particulars of any such proposed alterations or additions' shall be sent out in the notice convening the meeting.

(b) All such proposed alterations or additions, and any amendments to them which may be proposed and seconded, shall be put to the vote of the meeting, and provided that on show of hands, or if demanded by six members in writing, on a poll, a majority of two-thirds of the votes of those members present and voting shall be cast in favour of any proposed alterations or additions or amendments, then the same shall be deemed to be carried.
